A few introductory words on Roselend dam





- Constructed between 1955 and 1962 by Second constructed constructed by Second constructed con
- Buttress arch dam, 150m high and 804m lenght
- The largest concrete civil engineering structure in France: 940 000 m³
- Storage volume 187 hm³ on a surface of 320 ha
- Water flows through the turbines of La Bâthie power plant under a head of 1200m, 0 to 600 MW in less than 13 min



Context of the project emergence

- In 2013, in the Roselend area, a project to create a biotope protection area (wetlands and high altitude lawns) is being investigated by the municipality. It is stopped in 2014 due to strong opposition from some stakeholders
- In the meantime, under the impetus of ISO 14001 certification, EDF is seeking to put in place an ecological valuation of its land, with a management plan involving the municipality of Beaufort, the Savoie Conservatory of Natural Spaces, and the *Société d'Economie Alpestre de Savoie* (association participating in the management of Savoyard pastoral areas). When carrying out the natural inventories, strong opposition leads the project partners to mark a stopping point to think about how to pursue a common project together







Concertation and territorial dialogue: an obvious way forward

- Reasoned negotiation: method centered on the needs, interests and concerns of stakeholders. One of the driving forces is to know whether people understand each other, in particular when it comes to disagreements, with a very strong posture of neutrality expressed by the consultation manager
- Method is adapted to the co-construction on themes not necessarily linked to the environmental field
- \rightarrow This approach was launched in 2015

Concertation and territorial dialogue: an obvious way forward

- Twenty different structures have been identified
- 21 preliminary interviews by the mediator have been undertaken. An anonymous synthesis has been done, and was a great moment of listening and mutual understanding, which made it possible to structure the next steps of the consultation process
- 7 consultation meetings and 6 steering committees mobilizing fifty local stakeholders were organized in order to discuss, understand each other's points of view, and co-construct a project for Roselend









A project for Roselend: 3 lines of action

A project for Roselend: le Projet Roselend Organization of the shared governance of the project

- The shared territorial governance put in place makes it possible to guarantee the organization of the framework for exchanges, to propose adapted and shared solutions, and to federate the ecosystem of stakeholders
- In order to maintain the initial state of mind of the project over time, associated with the consultation process, the strategic steering committee has decided to adopt 4 shared values: dialogue, respect, benevolence and cooperation

To conclude

- The consultation process, the development of the Roselend Project and the carrying out of first concrete actions have made it possible to resolve first issues identified during the consultation process, maximize collective benefits, and initiate long-term joint management of the Roselend area
- The wounds of the past linked to the construction of the Roselend dam are healing and stakeholders now imagine the future in synergy rather than in opposition. Fears related to the preservation of a rich biodiversity compatible with the practice of the different uses of the area are allayed
- The challenge now is to perpetuate the approach "Together, bring our heritage to life" on a very long term, with visible effects for future generations
